Thank you for your May 22, 2011 letter to the North Carolina Attorney General's Consumer Protection Division concerning the Potomac-Appalachian Transmission Highline (PATH) project.

The North Carolina Attorney General's Office (AGO) intervened and filed comments in the PATH proceeding at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission. In addition, the North Carolina Utilities Commission issued an order in Dominion NC Power's application to join PJM that holds North Carolina's consumers harmless from cost increases resulting from Dominion's participation in PJM. Based on these factors and the demands on the AGO's resources, the AGO cannot expend additional resources to pursue this matter further at this time.
